Dress Code Policy

In order to promote a professional atmosphere, BPA's Board of Trustees has developed the following official dress code policy for the Business Professionals of America National Leadership Conference. Students, advisors, and chaperones must follow the dress code. It is recommended that all guests follow the established dress code policy.

Members not dressed in required attire will not be allowed to participate in any session or any competitive event. Members not adhering to the Professional Dress Code will not be allowed on stage.

Professional Dress Code

One of the professional dress options listed below is required for all General Sessions and Success Sessions, all Competitive Events (judged, non-judged, and open), Campaign Rally, Caucuses, Workshops, and the National Leadership Academy.

Women

- · Pant or skirt suit.
- Dress skirt or dress slacks with coordinated blouse and/or sweater.
- · Business professional "dress."
- BPA blazer with dress skirt or dress slacks and blouse or sweater

Dress shoes or dress sandals with heel are required with all of the above.

Men

- · Dress slacks, dress shirt, and tie.
- · Suit, dress shirt, and tie.
- · Sport coat, coordinated dress slacks, dress shirt, and tie.
- · BPA blazer with dress slacks, dress shirt, and tie.

Dress shoes and dress socks are required with all of the above.

Casual Dress

Casual dress is acceptable on Tours, the special event, and in the Exhibit Hall.

Women

- · Sportswear (jeans), pants, and shirt, · Sportswear (jeans), pants and shirt, T-shirt, and shorts.
- Footwear required with all of the above.

Men

- T-shirts, and shorts.
- Footwear required with all of the above.

The following are unacceptable during BPA activities: strapless tops, spaghetti straps, tube tops, halter tops, midriff tops, spandex, lycra, transparent clothing, cut-offs or ragged clothing, and clothing with inappropriate words and pictures.

> Swimsuits must be covered with appropriate attire while in any area except the swimming pool or designated sunbathing area.

Recourse: Members refused entrance to any event will be given the opportunity to change into appropriate attire immediately and participate/ compete in the event. Having changed into appropriate attire, members may join testing inprogress. No additional time will be given for time missed.

Members also have the right to grieve the issue immediately after being refused entrance. Grievance of the Dress Code policy will not be accepted if not received in writing at Competitive Events Headquarters within 15 minutes of the infraction in auestion.



Recognition


For all divisions, the top ten scores (including any possible ties) in each contest will be recognized and be called on stage to receive medallions.

Operating Rules of the Conference

The following are the Special Rules of Order adopted by majority vote of the division's conference voting delegates. These special rules require a 2/3 vote to suspend.

- All sessions shall be designated as non-smoking to include e-cigarettes.
- Identification badges shall be worn at all meetings and conference activities.
- Voting delegates shall be seated in a designated section, and it shall be the responsibility of the voting delegates to be properly seated for their votes to be counted.
- 4. Only voting delegates may make motions or speak to the motions.
- 5. Each delegate may speak twice to the 2014 National Leadership Conference

same motion.

- 6. All motions shall be in writing on a motion form and provided to the secretary with a copy for the presiding officer at the time the motion is presented.
- 7. Debate shall be limited to a total of ten minutes on each main motion. After roll call is finalized, voting delegates leaving the voting delegate section without an alternate replacement will be forfeiting his/her votes. An alternate voting delegate may be recognized to take the place of a voting delegate upon request to the presiding officer by the head voting delegate.

Election Procedures

The Policy & Procedures Rule, which states that Head Voting Delegates must attend the Campaign Briefing Meeting, will be strictly enforced. States not complying will lose all their votes.

The Candidate/Head Voting Delegate Briefing Meetings for Secondary and Post-Secondary Divisions will be held on Wednesday, April 30, at 3:00 pm at the JW Marriott-101/102. This meeting is for all Officer Candidates, Campaign Managers, and Head Voting Delegates. All National Officer Candidates must be present for this meeting. Ribbons will be handed out at this time, and campaign information will be provided. General Voting Delegates are invited to attend the Candidate/Head Voting Delegate Briefing Meeting, but are not required.

All campaign materials must be distributed only at the Campaign Rally during the specified time.

There will be no nominations from the floor. Any violation of the rules will be brought before the NLC Rules Committee. Any damage charges from the hotels will be charged to the candidate's State association.

Schedules will be distributed prior to the State caucuses. The top ten candidates for each division will have an opportunity to visit each State caucus. "Meet the Candidates" will be held at the individual State caucuses. The number of voting delegates will be based on the membership totals from each state association.

Secondary Division

The number of Secondary Voting Delegates is determined by granting each State Association five (5) votes plus additional votes, based on their paid student memberships received in the National Center February 15th. Membership dues received after February 15th, if postmarked prior to February 15, and if mailed first class, shall qualify for the February 15th deadline. Additional votes will be determined by multiplying the state student membership total by a factor of .003 and rounding to the nearest whole number.



Post-Secondary


- Expulsion from conference for any use or possession of illegal drugs by anyone or any use or possession of alcohol by minors, or intentionally causing damage to property.



Risk Management Plan

TO: BPA Advisors

SUBJECT: NLC Security and Disaster Recovery Plan

DATE: April 28, 2014

The National Center of Business Professionals of America (BPA) is dedicated to hosting a safe and successful National Leadership Conference (NLC) in Indianapolis, Indiana.

Insuring the safety of our members is our first priority and cannot be assumed to be the responsibility of the National Staff or the Risk Management Team. Each of us must be alert to potential problems and hazardous situations or behavior. If you witness something that you believe could endanger one of our members I trust you will take action immediately to address the problem and request aid from other sources as needed. This Risk Plan is intended to provide guidelines for action as well as important contact information.

Here are some important safety facts about the conference:

- Copies of the full Risk Management Plan will be available in conference headquarters, registration, and competitive event headquarters, as well as through the Director of Member Services & Events and the Executive Director.
- State Advisors will be given contact numbers for the Director of Member Services & Events, the Executive Director and other disaster team members.
- State Advisors will be encouraged to provide their cell phone (not mandatory) to be included in each of the plan copies available at the NLC.
- Please report all safety incidents/ concerns and accidents to Ric Cowles, Director of Finance. Ric will be available at the NLC Finance Desk located in the Marriott Downtown-Second Floor.

Security

Hotel security will be on staff each night walking the floors of the hotels. Hired security will also be present at The Special Event and Awards Sessions.

Wristbands

In addition to name tags, the 2014 NLC will feature a required plastic wristband. Here are some key points to remember and remind your students about the wristband:

- · Bands must be worn at all times.
- There will be no admittance to any function without a wristband.
- Name tags are still required, but the wristband is the must for admission to any event. Name tags remain mandatory for Competitive Events.
- The wristband may not be removed for the duration of the conference.
- The replacement price of a wristband is \$10, should it be removed. Only Advisors are allowed to purchase additional re-placement wristbands.
- Wristbands may be purchased at the Finance Desk.
- Guest, parents, chaperones, advisors, officers, members, alumni, exhibitors, speakers, board, and staff are all required to wear wristbands.
- Wristbands will be checked at all functions, anyone without a band will not be admitted.

Wristband Types
